NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Activities

MentorKids USA (the Organization) was formed in December 1996 under the laws of the state of Arizona. MentorKids USA is a Christian based organization that equips and empowers youth to be transformative leaders in their lives, their families, and their communities.

Net Assets

Net assets, revenues, gains, and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor or grantor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, net assets and changes therein are classified and reported as follows:

Net Assets Without Donor Restrictions – Net assets available for use in general operations and not subject to donor (or certain grantor) restrictions.

Net Assets With Donor Restrictions – Net assets subject to donor- (or certain grantor-) imposed restrictions. Some donor-imposed restrictions are temporary in nature, such as those that will be met by the passage of time or other events specified by the donor. Other donor-imposed restrictions are perpetual in nature, where the donor stipulates that resources be maintained in perpetuity. Gifts of long-lived assets and gifts of cash restricted for the acquisition of long-lived assets are recognized as restricted revenue when received and released from restrictions when the assets are placed in service. Donor-imposed restrictions are released when a restriction expires, that is, when the stipulated time has elapsed, when the stipulated purpose for which the resource was restricted has been fulfilled, or both.

Contributions restricted by donors are reported as increases in net assets without donor restrictions if the restrictions expire (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished) in the reporting period in which the revenue is recognized. All other donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in net assets with donor restrictions. When a restriction expires, net assets with donor restrictions are reclassified to net assets without donor restrictions and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of reporting cash flows, the Organization considers all highly liquid investments available for current use with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents. At times, the Organization's cash and cash equivalent balances may exceed federal deposit insurance limits.

NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Pledges Receivable

Unconditional promises to give that are expected to be collected within one year are recorded at their net realizable value. Unconditional promises to give that are expected to be collected in future years are recorded at the present value of their estimated future cash flows. An allowance is provided for pledges receivable when a pattern of uncollectibility has occurred. Conditional promises to give are not included as support until such time as the conditions are substantially met.

Property and Equipment

Acquisitions of property and equipment in excess of \$500 are capitalized. Property and equipment are stated at cost at date of acquisition, or fair market value at date of donation in the case of donated property. Property and equipment is depreciated over the lives of the assets using the straight-line method. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of the lease term or their estimated useful life. Donated assets are carried at the approximate fair value of the date of donation.

As of July 31, 2022, all property and equipment is fully depreciated.

Intangible Assets

Intangible assets consist of the costs to develop a trademark and website for the Organization. The total costs of the projects are amortized on a straight-line basis.

As of July 31, 2022, all intangible assets are fully amortized.

In-Kind Contributions

Donated items are recorded at estimated fair value at date of receipt.

Volunteers have donated 2,776 hours of time to the Organization's programs. These volunteer hours have not been recorded in the financial statements as they do not qualify for recording under accounting standards guidelines.

Functional Expenses

Salaries and related expenses are allocated based on job descriptions and the best estimates of management. Expenses, other than salaries and related expenses, which are not directly identifiable by program or supporting service, are allocated on the best estimates of management.

Use of Estimates

In preparing financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, management is required to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Tax Status

The Organization is a tax-exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and similar Arizona statutes. The Organization is not deemed a private foundation and contributions to the Organization are considered tax deductible.

The Organization follows the income tax standard for uncertain tax positions. Under this standard, the Organization recognized no liability for uncertain tax positions.

Adoption of Accounting Pronouncement

In September 2020, the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2020-07, *Presentation and Disclosures by Not-for-Profit Entities for Contributed Nonfinancial Assets*. This standard requires that contributed nonfinancial assets are reported on a separate line item in the statements of activities, apart from contributions of cash and other financial assets. It also requires disclosure of disaggregated amounts of contributed nonfinancial assets by category that depicts the type of contributed nonfinancial assets, donor restrictions and valuation techniques. The adoption of this standard did not have any impact on the accompanying financial statements or disclosures.

Accounting Pronouncement Not Yet Effective

In February 2016, FASB issued ASU 2016-02, *Leases*. This accounting standard requires organizations that lease assets to recognize a right-of-use asset and a lease liability, initially measured at the present value of the lease payments, in its statement of financial position. This accounting standard will also require additional disclosures about the amount, timing and uncertainty of cash flows arising from leases. This accounting standard is effective for the Organization as of fiscal year 2023. Management is currently evaluating the impact of adopting this accounting standard.

Subsequent Events

The Organization has evaluated subsequent events from the statement of financial position date through December 7, 2022, the date at which the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 2 LIQUIDITY AND AVAILABILITY

The Organization monitors liquidity regularly through the bi-monthly financial package provided to the board. The Organization's goal is to achieve 6 months to 12 months of liquidity. Financial assets available to meet cash needs for general expenditures within one year are \$1,010,584.

NOTE 5 PAYCHECK PROTECTION PROGRAM NOTE PAYABLE

During the year ended July 31, 2020, the Organization applied for and was approved a \$111,230 loan under the Paycheck Protection Program created as part of the relief efforts related to COVID-19 and administered by the Small Business Administration (SBA). The loan accrued interest at 1%, but payments were not required to begin for six months after the funding of the loan. Subsequent to this, the law changed the loan deferral terms retroactively. The PPP Flexibility Act and subsequent regulations supersede the loan agreement. The Foundation was eligible for loan forgiveness of up to 100% of the loan, upon meeting certain requirements. The loan was uncollateralized and was fully guaranteed by the United States federal government. The Organization received forgiveness of the loan during the year ended July 31, 2021.

The SBA may review funding eligibility and usage of funds for compliance with program requirements based on dollar thresholds and other factors. The amount of liability, if any, from potential noncompliance cannot be determined with certainty; however, management is of the opinion that any review will not have a material adverse impact on the Organization's financial position.

NOTE 6 SIMPLE IRA PLAN

The Organization has established a savings incentive match plan for employees (SIMPLE). The Organization matches full-time employee's elective contributions to the IRA account up to 3% of the employee's compensation. The Organization's expense for the plan during the year ended July 31, 2022 was \$8,366.

NOTE 7 LEASE COMMITMENTS

The Organization leases office and program space on a month-to-month basis. Total rent expense was \$38,351 for the year ended July 31, 2022.

NOTE 8 CONCENTRATIONS

During the year ended July 31, 2022, the Organization received approximately 10% of its total revenue from one donor.

NOTE 9 COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

The COVID-19 pandemic is having significant effects on global markets, supply chains, businesses, and communities. Specific to the Organization, COVID-19 may impact various parts of its 2023 operations and financial results. Management believes the Organization is taking appropriate actions to mitigate the negative impact. However, the full impact of COVID-19 is unknown and cannot be reasonably estimated as these events are still developing.



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
